Globally, the number of individuals with dementia will nearly triple to greater than 152 million by 2050 (AAIC, 2021). There is an impending need and an opportunity for Home Care agencies to provide education to their caregivers who assist people with dementia to help them maintain their current level of function in the home setting.
