OREGON SENIORS OPPOSE MEDICARE CUTS

A recent survey polled 550 registered voters in Oregon aged 65 and older to determine seniors' opinions on the value of healthcare services in the Medicare program and proposed cuts by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services that threaten to reduce Medicare payments.

Overwhelmingly, seniors support Medicare services and oppose additional cuts to the Medicare program.

Public Policy Polling completed this survey August 19-21, 2013. The survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.0 percent.
